Hawai'i ~ A Long Story Short

The ancient drama of the Hawaiian islands with their unique plants and animals is revealed in this short documentary for the visiting public. Narrated by Kayla Rosenfeld (Hawaii Public Radio), and with original music by Michael Tanenbaum, the film tells the story of the birth and destruction of these islands over millions of years, and how life, including people, found a new home in one of the most isolated places on Earth.

The work emerged from a graduate course on science documentary film-making taught by Dr. Eric Gaidos. It is the result of the collective effort of the instructor, a teaching assistant, eight students, and many individuals and agencies who contributed video, images, or assistance.
